Course objectives (aims)	The primary objective of the course is to study stages soviet national policy, to identify the role and influence of national policy on the state development.
Course contents	This module gives students a deep understanding of ethnic and confessional Processes in USSR. The module is divided into two broad parts. The first concerns the history of founding national policy in 1920s-1930s, and the second concerns specificity of national policy in the second half of the 20th century.
Learning outcomes	On successful completion of the course, students are expected to:  - demonstrate knowledge of the theory of Ethnic and Confessional politics in the USSR; - demonstrate practical knowledge of the implementation of theoretical concepts.  Be able to:  - use historical knowledge to understand the stages of state development, - use knowledge to identify the characteristics of various ethnic and confessional groups; - evaluate the results of the ethnic and confessional process in historical retrospective.
